About the University of Indianapolis and its Athens Campus

Founded in Indiana in 1902, the University of Indianapolis chartered the Athens Campus in 1989. Located at the foot of the Acropolis, it is the only wholly owned branch campus of a US university operating in Greece. The University offers 42 undergraduate programs and II graduate programs in Athens.

The AHEPA Journey to Greece Program

Duration

The first program starts July 3 and runs for two weeks, ending July 16. The second session starts July 10 and runs until August 6. Discounts are offered to students opting to take both sessions and to students who are returning.

Courses

Classes celebrating Greek language, culture and history are offered each year providing both an unforgettable learning experience and **up to nine transferable university credits** (if students attend both sessions). Academic credit is transferred to a student's home institution by an official transcript issued by the University of Indianapolis.

- Greek Art & Archaeology
- Greek Myth & Religion
- Ancient Greek Games
- Modern Greek Politics & Foreign Relations

Courses incorporate visits to the archaeological sites and museums. Students will also benefit from use of the University Library, Computer lab, including internet access, and the magnificent University of Indianapolis Cultural Center located in the midst of the ancient ruins of Athens.

Accommodation

Students attending the program will be housed in very close proximity to the University in

the Plaka area of Athens. The AHEPA Program Director and Counselors as well as University staff will be on hand to ensure the students'A welfare.

Catering

Lunch is provided every weekday and breakfast and dinner are provided on excursions.

Excursions

Excursions, designed with learning in mind as much as having fun, form an integral part of the program.

Sessions I and 2

This year we have arranged for session I and 2 to overlap so that students from both sessions can enjoy a cruise in the Aegean Sea calling in at some of the most popular Greek islands, including Crete, and visiting Kusadasi in Turkey.
